


Going to the American History Museum



The Smithsonian Institution's **National Museum of American History** has more than one front door.

Having extra doors helps many people enter a museum easily.

Forming Lines



If there are many people, a line forms.

This is okay.

Each person will have a turn to go into the museum.

Security Officer



There is a **security officer** at each door.

This is to keep people safe.

Checking Bags



Security officers **check all bags**, handbags, and backpacks.

They are looking for items that could be a problem in a museum.

Checking Bags




When I go to the museum there will be a security officer at the door.

- 1. Open my bag or backpack.
- 2. Give it to the security officer.
- 3. Walk through the scanner.
- 4. Wait to get it back.
