


OUR MUSEUM MAP




Morning at the Museum




Soon I will be visiting an exhibit at the Smithsonian Institution museum. We may use a map.



A map is a drawing of a place. People often use maps to figure out where they are or which way to go. Maps can be very helpful for people who are visiting a place for the first time.



There are maps of different exhibits. My adult may use it to help us find our way. There are arrows on the map marking a route through the exhibit. If we follow it, we will see all of the displays in chronological order. There are photos on the map, too, to show us what we will see next.



To use our map, we will need to stop now and then to look at it. If we like, we can cross off each exhibit that we have seen.



When we go to an exhibit, we may use a map to find our way and keep track of where we are!
