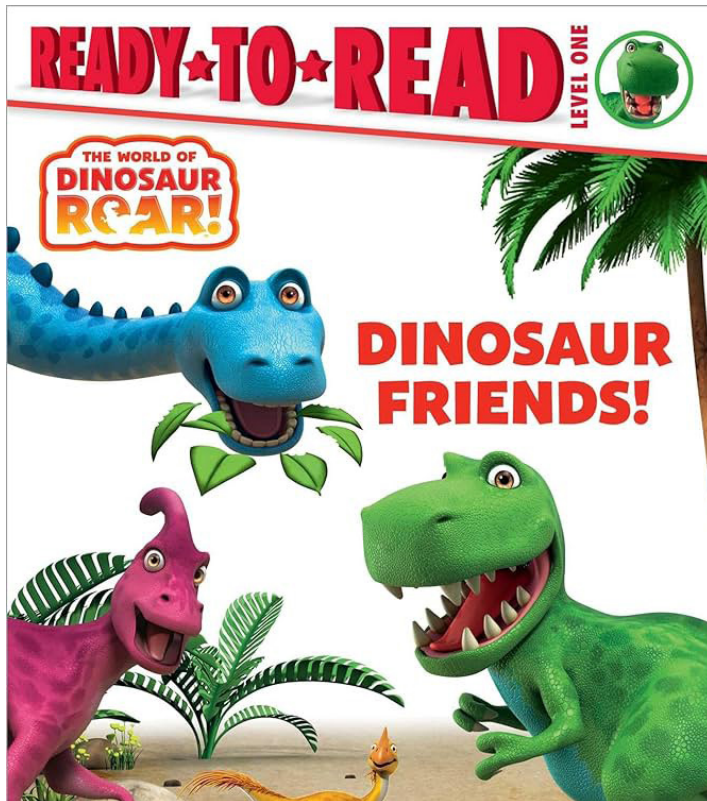


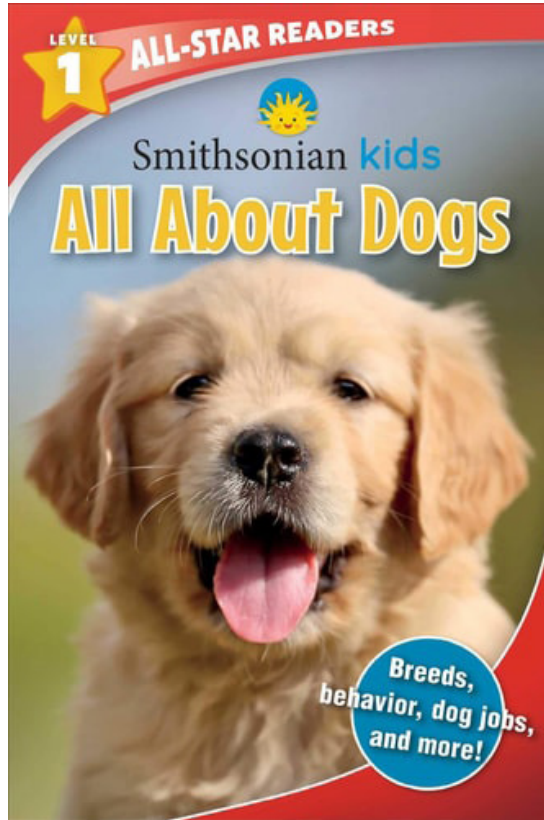
What Dinosaur Am I?

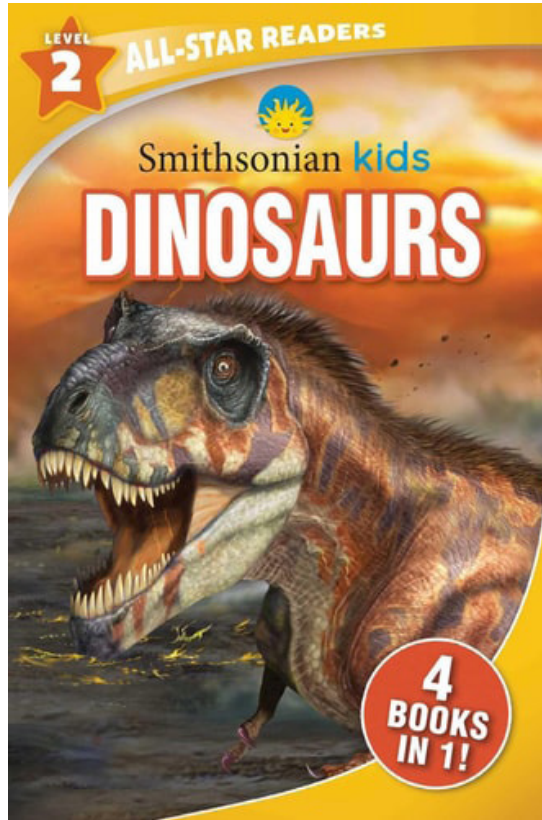
Dinosaur Friends!

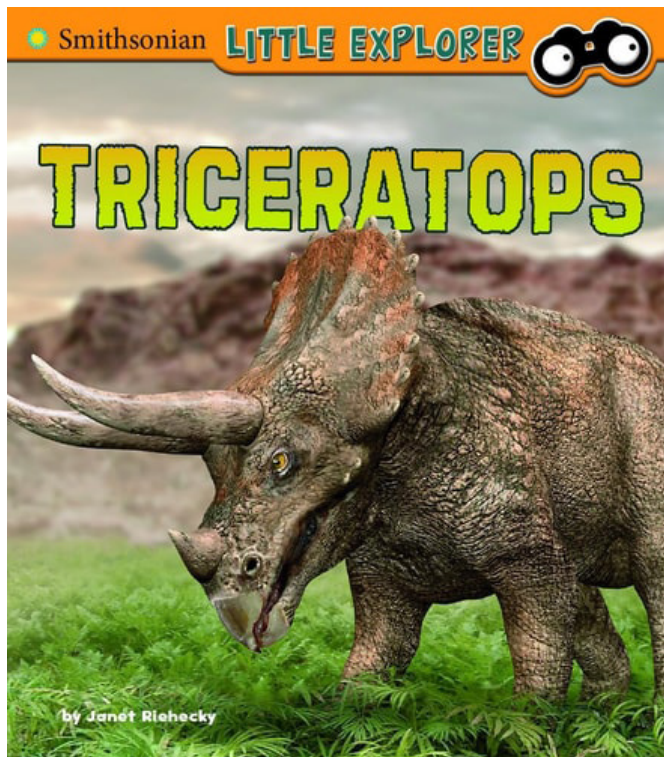
All About Dogs

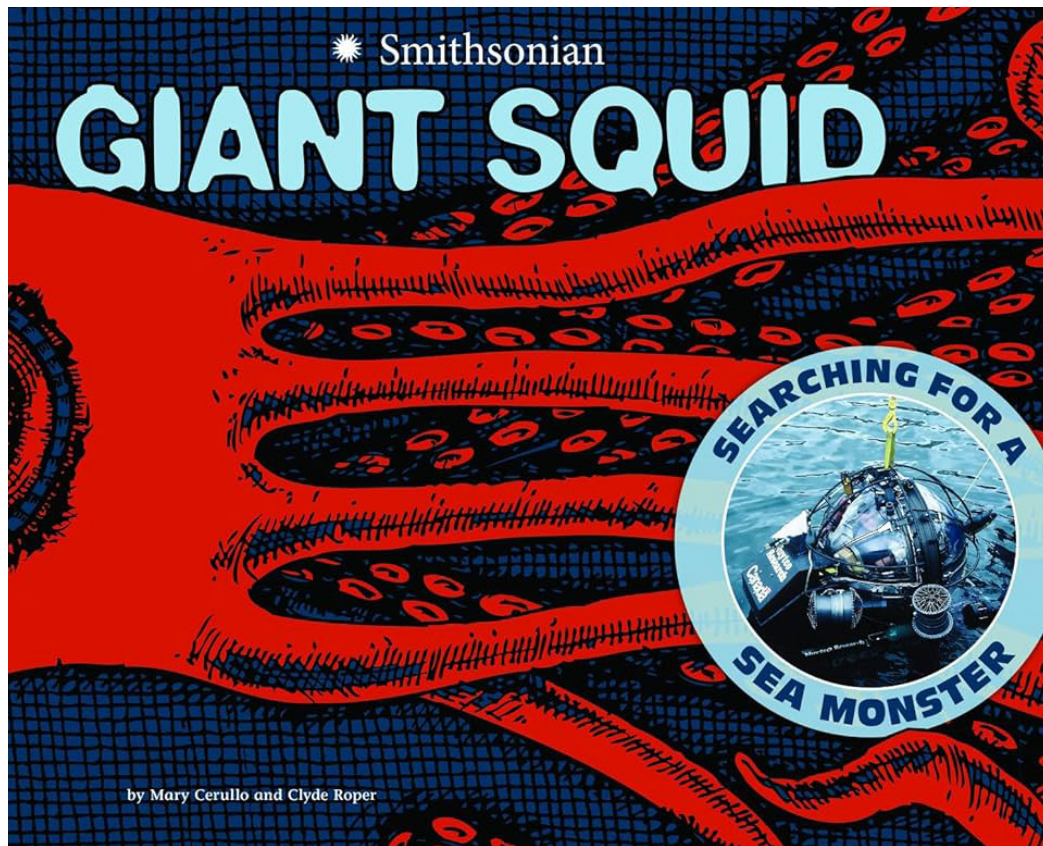
Dinosaurs Level 2

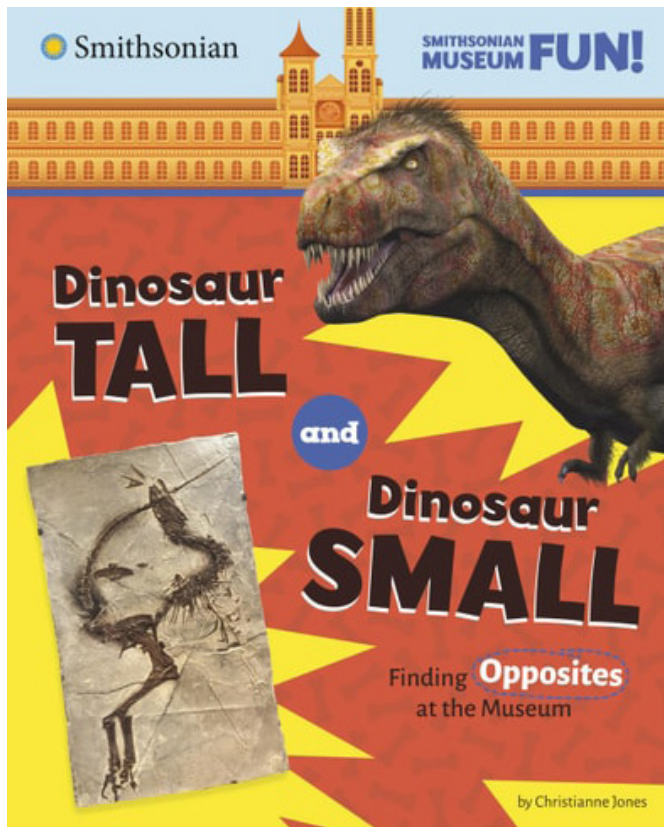
Giant Squid

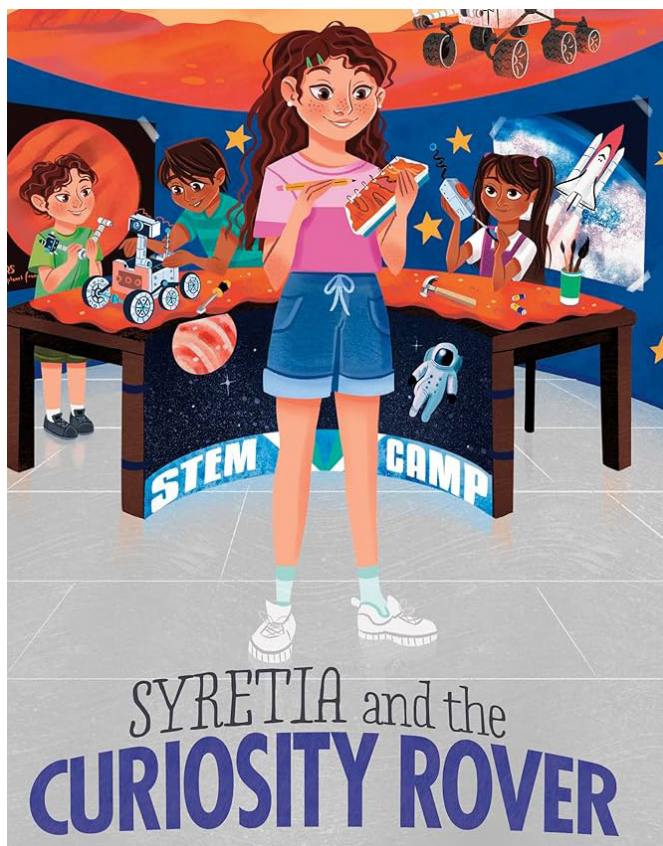
Monkeys Swing and Cheetahs Sprint

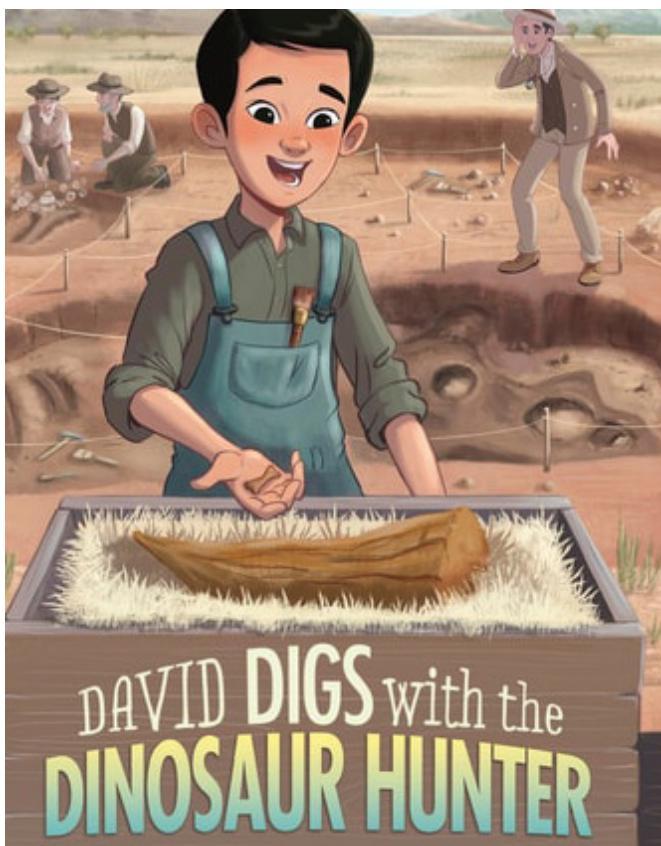
Dinosaur Tall and Dinosaur Small

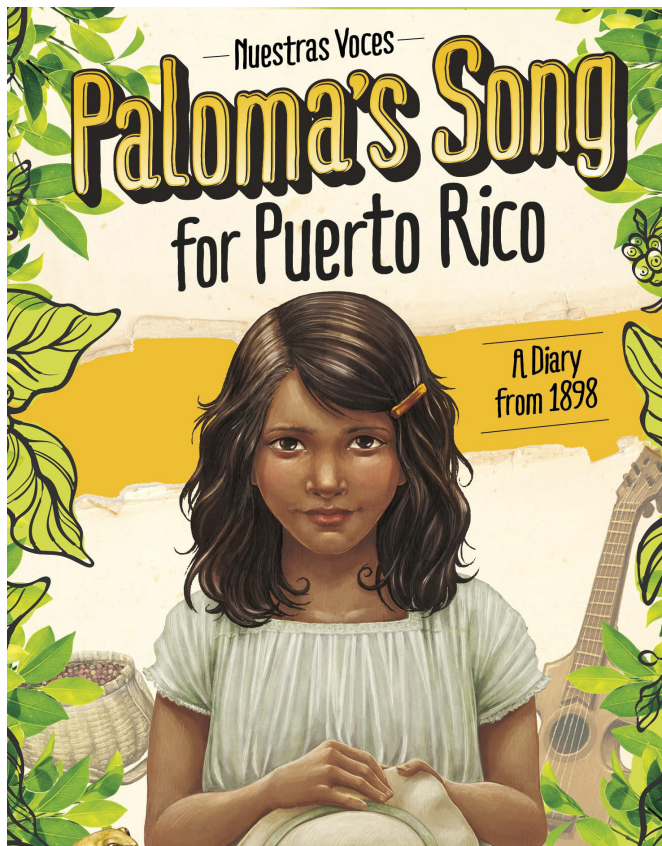
Syretia and the Curiosity Rover

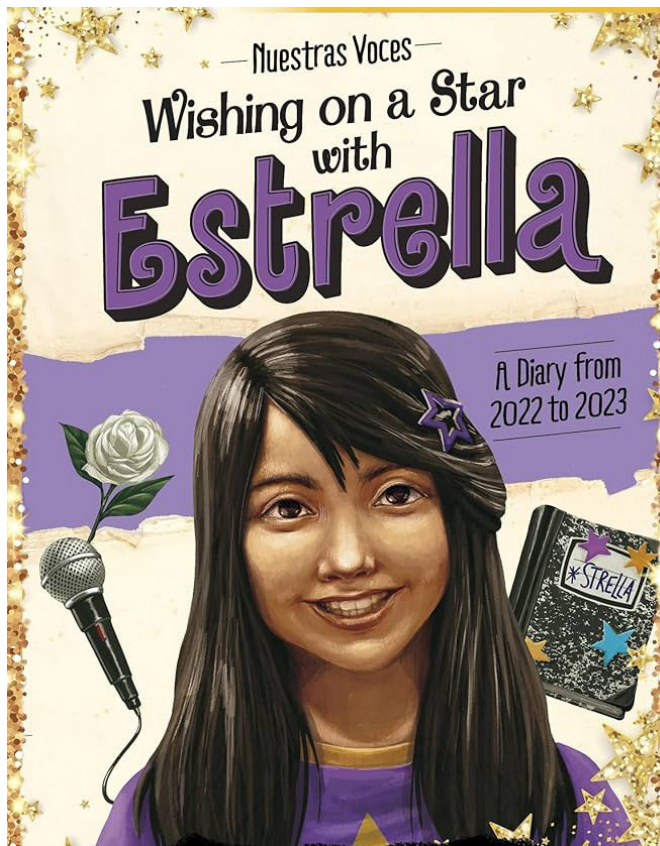
David Digs With the Dinosaur Hunter

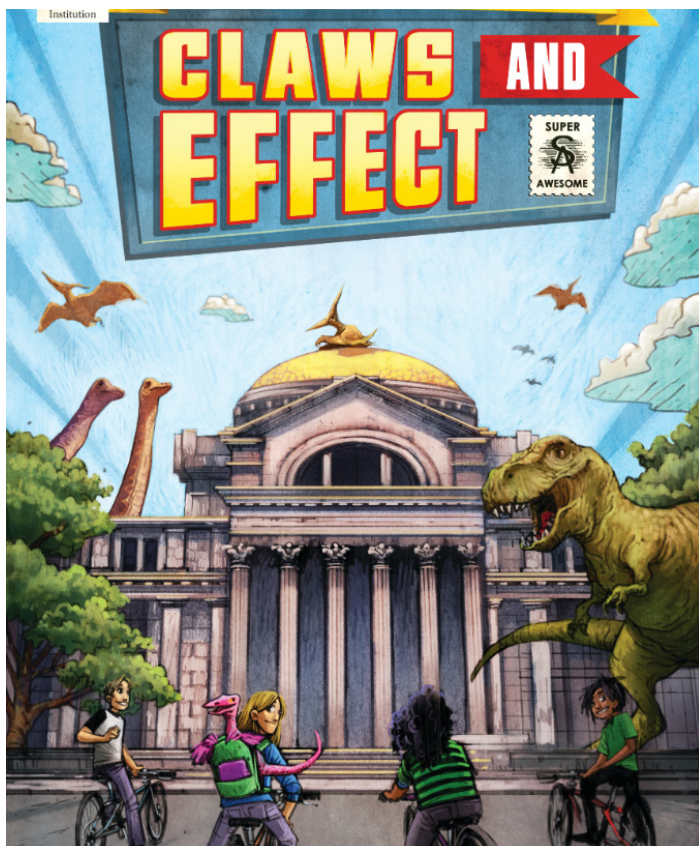
Wishing on a Star with Estrella
